## Lori's Story

Lori didn't want to come to camp, and she let us know within the first hour of arriving. On top of that, her best friend was killed in a senseless shooting two days prior. She was angry, sad, bitter, and struggling. It was the first time I felt like we might have a "runner" or significant disruption to the flow of camp.

As the week progressed, Lori opened up, and her walls slowly came down. She shared her frustrations and asked questions that come from experiencing life's traumas. Those conversations were precious.

After camp, Lori wrote this in her evaluation:

*"I have a better appreciation for God's creation. I grew in a deeper understanding of who Christ is, and I am closer to inviting Jesus Christ into my life. I appreciate how you share Jesus, you don't force Him or your faith on us. You share truth from the Bible and give us the opportunity to ask questions."*

Recently, I got a text from Lori wondering if she could spend time with me at Stonewater. I said, "Heck Yeah!" We spent the morning moving horses, hay, and poop! We enjoyed a beautiful afternoon on the trail, and she got to ride one of the Mustangs in the arena when we returned. We had a great day together, and I know God is working in her heart.

Dear Friend and Supporter of Youth Dynamics,

Young people today desperately need undistracted opportunities to hear the good news of Jesus Christ. They need time away from their devices, as we all do from time to time. It's hard for anyone to make space for God when none is available.

Christian research group, Barna, writes, "Devices and algorithms are claiming and shaping the attention of Gen Z." Further, they report, "Data shows that nearly seven in 10 teens (68%) agree that devices keep them from having real conversations."

Youth Dynamics provides opportunities for young people to experience real conversations with caring leaders. The youth quickly realize that their leaders love and support them as they form genuine relationships and engage in transformative outdoor adventures.

I was blessed this past summer to help lead a seven-day, 50-mile kayak trip on the Owyhee River with my son, Sam, and several of his unchurched friends. The theme of our trip was "Who is Jesus?"

Surrounded by God's beautiful creation, we navigated rapids and rocks through the third deepest river canyon in the USA. We discussed
