Jake's Story

Relational adventure ministry happens year-round here at Youth Dynamics. However, the summer adventure season is a prime opportunity to invite new middle and high school students to get involved. And this was such a summer.

Jake is an incoming seventh grader who had a hard time making friends and is trying to figure out how God fits into his life. Being new to Youth Dynamics, he heard about an upcoming raft trip and wanted to go (scholarship funds helped pay his way!). He knew some of the kids that were going, but he wouldn't consider them to be friends. Jake wanted to go anyway.

The ride down from Arlington, Washington, to the Oregon Adventure Base just outside Portland is where the bonding story of this group of energetic middle school students begins.

Jake didn't know everyone in the van, but he felt welcomed. During the entire trip, he felt included in games and conversations, and even when he was a little scared of whitewater rafting, he felt encouraged. Jake was making friends and was sharing more than normal. It felt good.

On the last day on the river, after hearing about God's love all week, Jake and the rest of the group were asked where they were in their relationship

> with God and compare it to their rafting experience. Were they in the boat paddling with the guide (God)? Were they holding onto the boat trying to get in? Or were they in the water watching the boat float by?

Jake felt safe with the group, so he shared that sometimes he felt like he was in the boat. But there were other times he felt on the outside of the boat, and he didn't know how to stay in the boat.

As each person shared, they committed to staying engaged with God and each other when they returned home.

The level of honesty and vulnerability this group of middle schoolers displayed with each other amazed the staff.

It will be exciting to continue to develop relationships with Jake and the rest of the students over the next school year.

It will also be exciting to see how these students support and encourage each other at school and in their daily lives.

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The Ministry is Expanding

Seeds are Being Cast Far and Wide — and They're Taking Root!

In August 2023, Youth Dynamics celebrated its 53rd year of ministry. God grew the ministry Paul and Connie Evans started in 1970 from one community in Washington state to 18 communities across Washington, Oregon, and Idaho with 55 staff and hundreds of volunteers. And the ministry is growing.

Last year, Youth Dynamics expanded ministry to Grangeville, Idaho, to offer its fourth adventure base to serve youth. The Salmon River Adventure Base will be the base of operations for new local ministries in the central Idaho region. It will also allow for logistical support to the other adventure bases, as well as future ministry expansion into Montana and beyond.

Last year, the ministry began in Riggins, Idaho, and Brewster, Washington. Coming soon, new ministry locations in Emmett, Idaho, and Tonasket, Washington.
