Bobby's Story

*Bobby started attending Youth Dynamics as a seventh grader. He loves participating in every drop-in and our weekly Connect nights (regular outreach). Bobby has built great relationships with several staff and volunteer leaders over the past two years.

Early in our relationship, I talked with Bobby about Jesus. I could tell he was uncomfortable but he was gracious to allow me to share about sin, and how Jesus made the ultimate payment for our rebellion through his life, death, and resurrection. Bobby politely listened but did not see the need for Jesus in his life.

A few months later, Bobby went on a full-day Wenatchee River trip facilitated by Stonewater Youth Dynamics. Between the amazing rapids were calm water sections that allowed us to ask students personal and spiritual questions.

As the guide went around the raft, each student shared. When it was Bobby's turn, he looked at the bottom of the boat for a few seconds and then made eye contact with me. Bobby looked at the guide and said, "I am good. I'll pass." We all honored his request and moved on to the next student, but I could tell some processing was happening.

The following year, Bobby attended Youth Dynamics Connect nights regularly, hearing salvation stories from loving and caring adult volunteers. When registrations opened for upcoming adventure trips, Bobby was the first to get his name on the list.

On another raft trip, we were in the same raft again, and the guide went around the boat again, asking students to share.

It's Bobby's turn to share, and this time he begins to share with confidence about being more open to receiving the Gospel in his life. He was very clear that a decision had not been made, but it was beginning to become clear to him.

invited to attend Senior High Snow Camp at Stonewater Youth Dynamics the following year. Throughout the weekend, the main speaker clearly articulated the Gospel and made an invitation to those who wanted to invite Jesus into their life. Bobby waited until the small group time to share about the past few years of processing the Gospel and stated that he was ready to put his faith in Jesus Christ!

Praise God!!

This is what relational adventure youth ministry is all about. Bobby had been hearing the Gospel from adults—on adventure trips and through weekly Connect nights throughout the year building relationships with other students and hearing the love of Jesus from other boys who knew Christ. Bobby is also attending the local church and feels welcomed into the community.

Joy, a regular student at every Youth Dynamics afterschool program in her local area, went on her first adventure trip last summer.

She eagerly participated in a thrilling whitewater rafting and rock-climbing expedition and embraced all the trip had to offer. Joy was the first to volunteer to help, and she engaged in the group conversations at the end of the day.

Joy was so thankful to be part of the trip. She was able to go because people gave to the scholarship fund. While she was only able to cover half the trip's cost, her determination to experience new adventures was unwavering.

Joy's challenges extended beyond financial constraints. Living in an trailer with her mother and sisters, she lacked the stability of a permanent home. Despite her circumstances, Joy's spirit remained resilient, and she yearned for more opportunities to explore and grow.

scholarship for a second adventure trip. This experience proved to be monumental in Joy's life, igniting her sense of adventure.

While she hasn't yet decided to follow Christ, she began grappling with profound questions about God and the pain in the world around her.

As Joy continues her journey, surrounded by uncertainty and challenges, staff who support her offer prayers for her peace and guidance.

Through her explorations and reflections, we hope that Joy may find solace and a sense of belonging in Jesus, who offers companionship through life's trials.
